CLOSURE OF THE PERMISSIVE PATH AROUND THE SET ASIDE FIELD

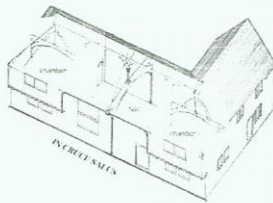
As you will see, from Philip Aitkens letter, inserted below, the set aside field is in the process of being sold.

To help negotiations with the prospective purchaser, the permissive path around the perimeter of the set aside field will be closed from 1st August 2017, until further notice.

To ensure the best chance of retaining the permissive path in the future, it is most important that we respect the closure and demonstrate to any new owners that we are a responsible community that can be relied upon.

The Parish Council thank you in advance for your cooperation and commit that they will work towards the best possible outcome for the village.

Dear Mr Sadler,

Further to my letter of 21st April 2017 we can confirm that the permissive path around the perimeter of the field at Brook Farm, Lackford will be closed until further notice from the 1st of August 2017 while negotiations for the sale of the property continue to proceed. This includes any informal permissions given for horse-riding around the path towards the Northern exit onto the main road.

This change does not of course affect Rights of Access held by purchasers of land from Brook Farm at the rear of their properties in Bury Road, Holden Road and Kent Road. In most cases the route enjoyed by these householders is to the South entrance gate onto Holden Road.

We would be grateful for your cooperation in ensuring that this request is observed by the residents of Lackford. We cannot give any guarantee that a purchaser will revive the permissive path, but undoubtedly they will be influenced by the respect that is given to this current request.
